Meeting Summary

Strategic Initiative Action Items

NESDI Statewide Technology Action Items. A draft version of the action items were reviewed and approved to move to NITC. The NITC requested that the strategic initiatives include strengths/assets, challenges/issues, recent accomplishments, and recommendations.

Working Group Reports. Geodetic and Survey Control – the summary and recommendations document has been started and a list of questions regarding Nebraska's needs and recommendations in this area will be proposed. Elevation - The contract for the South Platte LiDAR acquisition project was awarded to Woolpert, Inc. According to the contract, the acquisition should be completed by the end of Spring 2016 with the final data available by February, 2017 at the latest. Due to costs being lower than estimated, there will be left over funds to expand to areas adjoining the initial project area. Mr. Schonlau reported that the eastern Nebraska LIDAR project has submitted a proposal to 3DEP to acquire and process data from Douglas, Sarpy, and Lancaster counties and will also include parts of Dodge and Washington counties and the cities of Blair and Fremont.

Imagery - A draft RFI (Request for Information) for Imagery acquisition and data services has been completed and will be released as soon as November 6.

Land Records - Approximately, 74 counties have provided data with a remainder of 14 counties to be completed. The Office of the CIO and Dept. of Revenue will be meeting with county assessors to discuss next year's process and timelines.

Street Centerline and Address - Rob Christian, with the Department of Roads, will assist Mr. Watermeier in serving as Co-Chair of the work group. There is a lot happening at national level relating to the 2020 Census and NG911 as it relates to this topic. The work group will be gearing up to address these issues.

NebraskaMAP - Geospatial Data and Content Management Policy was discussed to handle requests to support data shared through NebraskaMAP. Members were asked to review the document. The question was whether this policy should follow the route of NITC Standards or standalone policy, similar to other operational policies within the OCIO. Mr. Watermeier will follow up with the NITC Technical Panel for guidance. The intent for this policy applies to all data stewards, regardless of state agencies, that want their data shared through NebraskaMAP. Metadata Standards - The work group developed metadata categories and definitions to assist the understanding of minimum and complete metadata requirements located in the current metadata standards. These categories and definitions will be incorporated into the current Metadata Standards and expected to be voted on for the next GIS Council meeting. A release date for NebraskaMAP needs to be scheduled and could be as early as early 2016.

2016 Goals. The 2016 Goals were presented and approved.

Communications Strategy and Outreach

NESDI Fact Sheets. Jon Swanson, OCIO GIS Intern, has been working on several of the NESDI fact sheets including elevation, imagery, and land records.

Census 2020

Preparations are underway to begin assisting with geospatial data for the Census 2020 project. Nancy Cyr, Casey Dunn, Rob Christian, Bill Wehling, and Nathan Watermeier met to discuss this and will develop a process paper. If anyone is interested in serving on this committee, they were to contact Mr. Watermeier or the Council Chairs.

State GIS Coordinators Report

State GIS Enterprise. Ed Toner, Chief Information Officer, was introduced to the Council. Mr. Toner stated that there are changes already in place to increase cost effectiveness. The Office of the CIO has a Cloud environment and is looking at ways for cost savings for state government. The goal is to have the infrastructure across the state located at two data centers. A consolidated service center tool is being shared with other state agencies. There are 90 counties now utilizing the OCIO data center in some fashion. Great partnerships have developed already towards the Office of the CIO's 18 month plan. Mr. Watermeier is working with Mr. Toner and the OCIO's plan to develop a State GIS Enterprise platform.

Geospatial Data Act of 2015. The Policy Research Office did not approve the Council's letter of support. Members were encouraged to write individual letters to their senators.

Federal Initiatives and News. Addressing - The White House recently added this as a national initiative. At the next NSGIC meeting in February, a working group will work on a plan of action for states. Imagery for the Nation - The federal

agencies are evaluating needs for minimum leaf-on 12-inch imagery.

GIS Day 2015, November 18-19, 2015. Plans are underway to have a couple of days of GIS activities for state agencies. On November 18, there will be several presentations by state agencies. This will be followed by a hands-on metadata workshop in the afternoon. On the 19th, there will be a full day of hands-on training for both beginner and advanced users of Geocortex. The GIS/LIS Association is discussing doing a "mappy hour" in Lincoln or Omaha.

Working Group Reports

<u>Geodetic and Survey Control</u> An initial draft has been started on the document. We are currently working on a list of questions regarding Nebraska's needs and recommendations in this area. Once that is completed it will be sent out to the initial group for review.

<u>Elevation</u> The contract for the South Platte LiDAR acquisition project was awarded to Woolpert, Inc. According to the contract, the acquisition should be completed by the end of Spring 2016 with the final data available by February, 2017 at the latest. This would be for the 3DEP BAA contract that was awarded to Nebraska. Mr. Langtry commented that the delivery may take up to 1-1 ½ years due to all the projects nationwide and how they are prioritized across states. Due to costs being lower than estimated, there will be left over funds to expand to areas adjoining the initial project area. Mr.

Schonlau reported that the eastern Nebraska LIDAR project has submitted a proposal to 3DEP to acquire and process data from Douglas, Sarpy, and Lancaster counties and will also include parts of Dodge and Washington counties and the cities of Blair and Fremont. The fate of this proposal should be known by end of the year.

<u>Imagery</u> Several members of the Imagery work group developed a draft RFI (Request for Information) for Imagery acquisition and data services. Some comments have been received and were incorporated into the final RFI. The RFI will be released as soon as this Friday, November 6. The document is in the Council's SharePoint site if members would like to review the document.

<u>Land Records</u> The first year of the project is nearly complete. Approximately, 74 counties have provided data with a remainder of 14 counties to be completed. Jeff Timm is working on integrating the data from counties and is about 50% done. The Office of the CIO will be meeting with county assessors to discuss next year's process and timelines.

<u>Street Centerline and Address</u> Rob Christian, with the Department of Roads, will assist Mr. Watermeier in serving as Co-Chair of the work group. There is a lot happening at national level relating to the 2020 Census and NG911 as it relates to this topic. The work group will be gearing up to address these issues. Mr. Watermeier serves on a national committee for addressing and NG9-1-1 and will be gathering additional federal requirements moving forward.

NebraskaMAP

- Geospatial Data and Content Management Policy was discussed to handle requests to support data shared through NebraskaMAP. Members were asked to review the document. The question was whether this policy should follow the route of NITC Standards or standalone policy, similar to other operational policies within the OCIO. Mr. Watermeier will follow up with the NITC Technical Panel for guidance. The intent for this policy applies to all data stewards, regardless of state agencies, that want their data shared through NebraskaMAP.
- Metadata Standards. The work group developed metadata categories and definitions to assist the understanding of minimum and complete metadata requirements located in the current metadata standards. The GIS Council members were asked to review the categories and definitions and send comments to Mr. Watermeier. These categories and definitions will be incorporated into the current Metadata Standards and expected to be voted on for the next GIS Council meeting. An example metadata template and standalone application is also being worked on to assist others with building metadata sets. It will be available to the public as well.
- The release date for NebraskaMAP needs to be scheduled and could be as early as early 2016. The working group will meet and discuss the necessary items to complete to better gauge the release date. A marketing plan is also being discussed to further advertise and promote the online service. The GIS Council will have an opportunity prior to the official release date.
