### CYBERSECURITY COMMUNITY PRESENTATIONS

(Moved up in the agenda to accommodate speaker's schedules.)

Rick Haugerud, Assistant Vice President of IT Security Services for the University of Nebraska, provided a presentation regarding cybersecurity goals, initiatives, and collaborative efforts.

Andy Boell, Chair of the Northeast Nebraska Network Consortium, provided a presentation regarding the consortium's formation and its cybersecurity initiative. The consortium is pleased that the ESU perspective is involved in solutions discussions. The consortium is interested in having a representative from the Education Council serve on their consortium. The consortium is developing a charter.

Members agreed with the concept of the K20 perspective and collaboration. It was suggested to adding public libraries as well. Another issue to address regarding cybersecurity is governance and the institution's policies and procedures. It would be helpful if all institutions had similar policies and procedures. Geographic location and the size of schools will affect policies and procedures. Conducting audits was another recommended area to discuss. Funding and cost have always been an issue for institutions. More funding is needed.

Patrick Wright, State Information Security Officer, informed the council that federal funding will be available soon for cybersecurity initiatives. NEMA will be the grantor of the 4-year funding. They will be establishing a committee to assist them with the application process. More information about the committee and funding will be coming out soon.

# TASK GROUP REORGANIZATION

Rationale for Proposed Group Structure Consider Approval of New Task Group Structure

No quorum was present to conduct official business, but the council proceeded with discussion.

A couple of the challenges with the Council's task groups are leadership of a task groups, time involved, size of the task group. All members are busy with their positions and serving on task group would involve more time. Need members who are committed and dedicated to the council and its action items. It was difficult to reach quorum for the task group meetings. Alternates can also serve on the task force groups.

In discussions with the former NITC Education IT Manager and the co-chairs, to reach achievable results, they proposed that there be a task force assigned to each of the 6 action items.

### **GEER I PROJECT UPDATE**

Ms. Kingery reported that the following projects were approved:

- Network Nebraska Backbone Upgrade.
- DDoS Mitigation Appliances
- Eduroam Year 2 dues
- Eduroam Year 3 dues were built into the Network Nebraska budget
- Eduroam equipment and labor costs. eduroam has seen an increase in participation from 30% to 40% since the announcement of the funds
- Broadband automated speed test. The first testing has been completed and the
  project has posted metrics. Mr. Needham stated that the ESU's may want to look
  at the Eduroam projects. Eduroam.us website has information regarding
  participants.
- TV white space. The project is looking for sites within ESU 10 as a site test location.

### **EDUROAM PRESENTATION**

Brett Bieber, Assistance Vice President, IT Client Services, Information Technology Services, University of Nebraska. provided an eduroam status report. Mr. Bieber entertained questions from the Council members.

### **CAUCUS FOR HIGHER EDUCATION Co-Chair**

The Higher Education sector nominated Dr. Paul Turman as the Co-Chair representing higher education. Dr. Turman accepted the nomination. There was no quorum present to approve the nomination. This will be on the December meeting agenda. After the Council approves the nomination, it will need to be approved the NITC.

### DISTANCE EDUCATION UPDATE

Mr. Needham commented that eduroam is assisting with the digital equity in higher education. ESUs are still working though some technical issues before implementation.

### **NETWORK NEBRASKA UPDATES**

Mr. Needham distributed the current makeup of the Network Nebraska Governance Structure draft document. Asked members to review it. NOC asked for this information.

Network Nebraska Fee Structure Collaboration\*. Ron Cone, ESU 10, is Co-chair of NNAG (Network Nebraska Advisory Group). NNAG is in the process of reviewing Network Nebraska fees and would like the Education Council's input and participation with the review. The Network Nebraska membership has grown from 93 to over 200 participants – libraries and museums have joined. The question has been raised as to where the fee was appropriate for all schools - larger school's costs versus smaller or rural school's cost. If not, how would the tiers be developed or determined, etc. The time involved would be 2 to 4 one-hour meetings a month between now and February. NAWG will be making fee decisions at the March or May meeting. Trent Kelly (K12) and Dr. Turman (Higher Education) volunteered. It was suggested to look at a consumption-based fee or a base rate fee. Ms. Kingery noted that there is also the "quarter" option that has not been used or needs clarification.

**Marketing Plan Volunteer.** Ms. Struebing, NDE, has been working on some documents. She volunteered to develop a Marketing Plan. Members were asked to send her ideas. Volunteers are welcome.

**2022 RFP Update.** Ms. Kingery reported that the smaller RFP for 10 schools and a few libraries is almost ready for release. Hopefully, more providers will compete. The larger

RFL for 250 circuits will be expiring. Planning, preparation and discussions for the 2023 RFP will need to begin soon.

**CISA Grant Liaison.** FEMA has received a CISA (Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency) FEMA Cybersecurity grant. The committee would like to have one Education Council volunteer to assist the project, and, to provide status updates to the Council. Ms. Sherry Polenski, CIO for State College Systems, is already part of the discussions, and will serve as the EC representative.

# **TASK GROUP REORGANIZATION** (Continued)

Last month, it was proposed to have task group for each action items. Most members agreed that too many task groups would be too time consuming. Between now and the December meeting, the new co-chairs will discuss the reorganization of the Task Groups and bring recommendations to the group.

Dr. Turman left the meeting.

University of Nebraska. Mr. Buker reported that UNL is preparing to release RFP for 400g internet.

Public K-12 and ESUs. Ms. Kingery provide the GEAR funding contact for questions regarding notification of applications. Mr. DeTurk informed the Council that ESU 2 is in an Interlocal agreement regarding Cyber Security to work on the coordination of efforts. GEAR funds have been used to upgrade Network Nebraska equipment and is currently being deployed.

Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education. Dr. Fimple updated the Council on SARA's (State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement) national requirements which may make it harder for states to comply and implement. The national office is in the process of hiring a new Executive Director. The Nebraska Indian College is wanting to participate in SARA

Nebraska Department of Education. Ms. Stuebing reported that she attended a national conference and met other E-Rate Coordinators. They were able to meet and discuss concerns and issues with FCC and USC reps.

There were no reports from the Nebraska State Colleges, Nebraska Community Colleges, Nebraska Independent Colleges and Universities, Private/Denominational K-12, and Nebraska Public Media.

# Current Legislative Bills 1<sup>st</sup> Regular Session 2023

### **LB635**

"to provide powers and duties to school districts, schools, and the Nebraska Library Commission relating to an educational resource database provided to students in kindergarten through grade twelve"

**Committee: Education** 

Any educational research databases provided by school districts, schools, and the Nebraska Library Commission must provide filtering, or block access to all materials deemed "obscene or harmful" to minors, unique accounts must be created for each student provided by the school district with credentials provided to parents/guardians.

Becomes operative August 1, 2023.

"To adopt the Nebraska K-12 Cybersecurity and Data Protection Act"
Committee: Education

Establishment of a cybersecurity team by the ESU Coordinating Council to conduct statewide needs analysis to determine appropriate cybersecurity measures for utilization by ESUs and their member school districts.

### **LB650**

Addendum to 84-712.05: "To allow certain records relating ty cybersecurity to be withheld from the public" Committee: Government, Military and Veterans Affairs

Amended to include records relating to the nature, location, or function of cybersecurity by the State of Nebraska or any of its political subdivisions to existing law pursuant to restrictions from public disclosure with exceptions for open administrative meeting, open meeting, or open court, etc. Appoints adoption and promulgation of rules and regulations for specific provision to the NITC.

# LB651

To adopt "an act relating to appropriations for cybersecurity; ... and to provide funding for enhancing political subdivisions' cybersecurity"

**Committee: Appropriations** 

Appropriate \$20M of General Funds annually beginning in 2023-24 to the Department of Administrative Services Information Management Services Division for the purpose of supporting the following: cybersecurity preparedness activities; procurement of tools, hardware, etc. for cybersecurity defense; increase cyber incident response capabilities; expand vulnerability monitoring; support cybersecurity workforce development within the state; etc.

\$3M of appropriated funds (with \$1M for salaries/per diems) for: security of cybersecurity vulnerabilities within vendor ecosystems; provide access to observable cybersecurity vulnerabilities; notification of state executive agencies' vendors of specific vulnerabilities.

\$8M of appropriated funds for: upgrades to critical IT infrastructure.

\$4M of appropriated funds for: software and services.

\$4.5M of appropriated funds (with \$250k for salaries/per diems) for: negotiation of contracts
