CURRENT NEBRASKA BROADBAND INITIATIVES

Diane Lowe, Grants & Budget Directory, Nebraska Broadband Office, presented information to the Council regarding the BEAD and Digital Equity grants. The State of Nebraska received. The State of Nebraska received \$405 million for grant projects. Information regarding the funding vision, goals and application process. The tentative timelines for the project were as follows:

NITC UPDATE

Ms. Kingery reported that the NITC met in July. New members were approved. For the Education Council report, Ms. Kingery provided an update on the RFPs and action items for the Statewide Technology Plans. Commissioners are inquisitive and want to learn about the Councils. At the November meeting, the Commission will review and approve the Statewide Technology Plan.

NETWORK NEBRASKA UPDATE

The mega RFP has been awarded. Ms. Kingery believes this will be one of the most successful buildouts the project has experience. As of today, only one site is behind schedule but feels the project is on schedule as a whole. The state has a good relationship with the vendors.

NITC EDUCATION COUNCIL REVIEW

As August is the first meeting of the new term, it is a good time to review the Council's charter and purpose. Nebraska is unique in that it is one of very few states that bring K12 and higher education, public and private, as well as NDE, CPPE, CIO and NPM, come to the table to collaborate IT efforts and distance learning,

STATEWIDE TECHNOLOGY PLAN REVIEW

Members were asked to review the SWTP one last time and provide any feedback and input. Ms. Kingery will update the data with current Network Nebraska data. The plan will be approved by the NITC at their November meeting.

LB1: Adopt the Property Tax Growth Limitation Act, the School District Property Tax Relief Act, and the Advertising Services Tax Act and change revenue and taxation provisions, introduced by: Linehan. Potential Impact: Amended existing law to adjust existing taxation provisions and redefine terms for property, sales, school districts, use, income and several other types of taxes.

Notes: Emergency Declared

Status: Incorporated into LB 34

LB2: Provide, change, and eliminate appropriations for operations of state government, introduced by: Clements. Potential Impact: Operational budgets for several divisions within State Agencies were provided for, amended, or eliminated. Specifically, the budget that housed costs associated with the NITC were adjusted from General Funds to Revolving Funds.

Status: Incorporated into LB34 Committee:

LB34: Adopt the Property Tax Growth Limitation Act and the School District Property Tax Relief Act and change provisions relating to revenue and taxation, introduced by Brewer. Potential Impact: Amended existing law to adjust existing taxation provisions and redefine terms for property, sales, school districts, use, income and several other types of taxes.

LB402: Propose an interim study to examine and monitor broadband expansion in Nebraska, introduced by Senator Wendy DeBoer and Senator Bosn

SUBSECTOR REPORTS (if time permits)

University of Nebraska, Andrew Buker. The University is upgrading the WAN network, which serves Network Nebraska, to 400 GB capability. Dr. Lindburg commented that enrollment of the hybrid online courses is increasing. Micro credentials partnerships are increasing to provide course offerings for students.

Nebraska State Colleges, Cheri Polenski. State college institutions are working on Security and business continuity plans. October is Cybersecurity month. The state colleges will be doing tabletop exercises.

Nebraska Community Colleges, Tom Peters. Mr. Peters did not have an update to report. Mr. Eckmann reported that fraudulent applications for admissions in on the increase. Currently, these are being handled through business processes but at some point, he would like to brainstorm with K12 sector.

Nebraska Independent Colleges and Universities, Derek Bierman. The institutions are also working on security, financial information, and fraud. An application for this is in place but it has not been implemented. Mr. Ourada informed the Council that Wesleyan is researching social engineering and addressing security. It is difficult to budget when vendors continue to increase their prices.

Public K-12 and ESUs. Mr. Chrisman indicated that there has been an increase with phishing. Mr. Robke stated that they will be having Cybersecurity Preparedness Workshops in October at no charge and invited members to attend. Mr. Needham stated that Canvas has a new computer science course available. He hopes that this will help solidify commitment to canvas. This is new requirement (computer course) for high school student. Mr. Needham gave kudos to the OCIO and Network Nebraska team in writing and completing the mega RFP.

Private/Denominational K-12, Stephen Hamersky. Mr. Hamersky stated that his sector has also been addressing cybersecurity issues.

Nebraska Public Media, Ling Sun. Nebraska Public Media has implemented an AI based closed captioning application in Spanish and English which was used during the special session. The new General Manager, Stacey Decker, will be taking his new position on October 14th. He is replacing Mark Leonard.

Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education, Dr. Mike Baumgartner. The new rules for Reciprocity have not been released. There are lots of concerns regarding affordable distance education. The CCPE is implementing new financial aid programs. There are still dollars available for teachers looking for dual credit. The computer science would quality.

OTHER BUSINESS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Nebraska Cybersecurity Conference is on Tuesday, September 17th, at the Nebraska Innovation Campus Conference Center. It is hosted by the Office of the CIO and Southeast Community College. Registration is still open.
